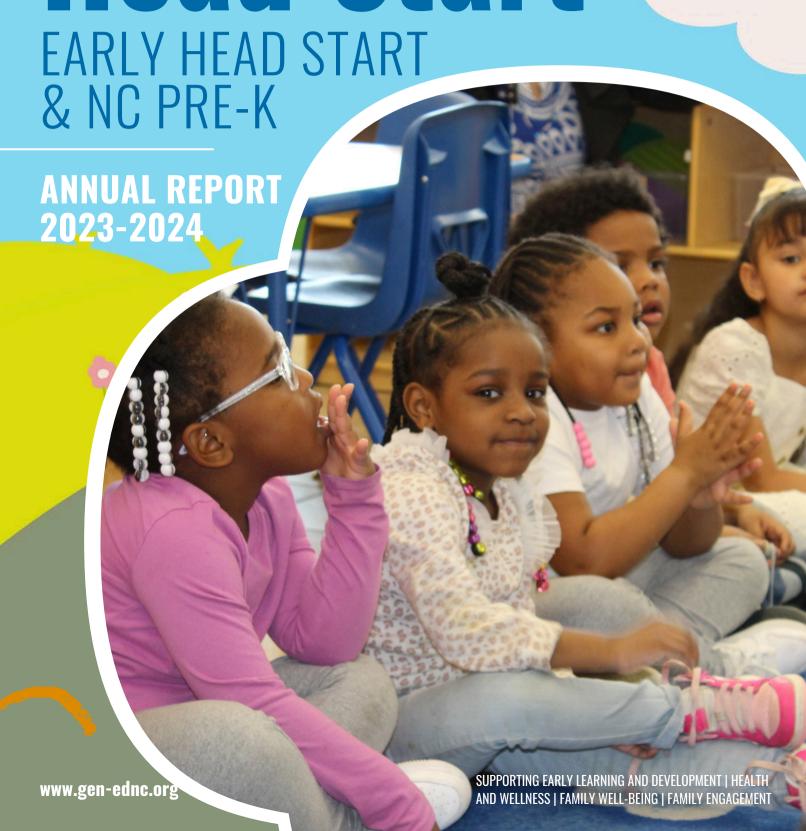

### **Who We Are**

GenerationEd is a nonprofit community organization committed to empowering generations through education.

Established in 1967 as United Day Care Services, we were part of a collective effort to ensure that low-income families living in Greensboro, NC had access to high-quality and reliable childcare. More than 50 years later, we are still advocates for early education, and now serve more than 1,200 families in Guilford and Rockingham Counties each year through our Head Start/Early Head Start and NC Pre-K programs.





Recognizing the transformative power of education across all ages and stages of life, we continue to provide families with opportunities to learn and grow through innovative programs that promote infant and maternal health, adult education and career readiness, literacy and family engagement, and training to become the best parents and early education professionals possible. We are proud to serve more than 6,000 families annually through each of these programs.

# **Community Assessment**

A comprehensive Community Assessment was conducted to evaluate the essential services currently provided by GenerationEd and to understand how the community's needs might shape future service delivery. So, what did we learn?

### **Key Findings**



### Service Area Needs and Strengths Differ

The assessment found significant differences in the strengths and needs of Guilford and Rockingham counties. Because of these differences each county's unique environment, culture, resources, and population demographics should be taken into account when planning services.



### **Building and Strengthen Partnerships is Key**

We should focus on building new community partnerships and strengthening existing ones. These relationships will help direct resources to the most vulnerable people. GenerationEd can lead and guide local governments and others to address economic, educational, and racial/ethnic disparities, creating positive change in our community.



# **Expanded Services Could Better Meet Community Needs**

We should keep working to offer more programs for low-income families and build partnerships with local service providers. We should also lead efforts to create more affordable, high-quality childcare. Whenever possible, we should also try to expand our services.

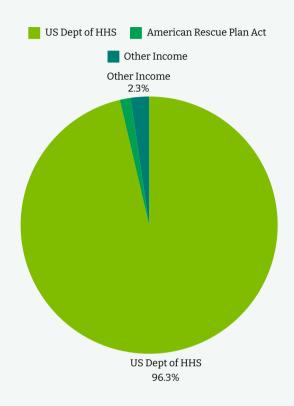

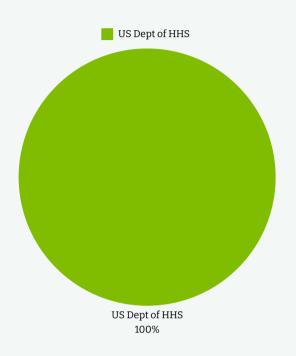

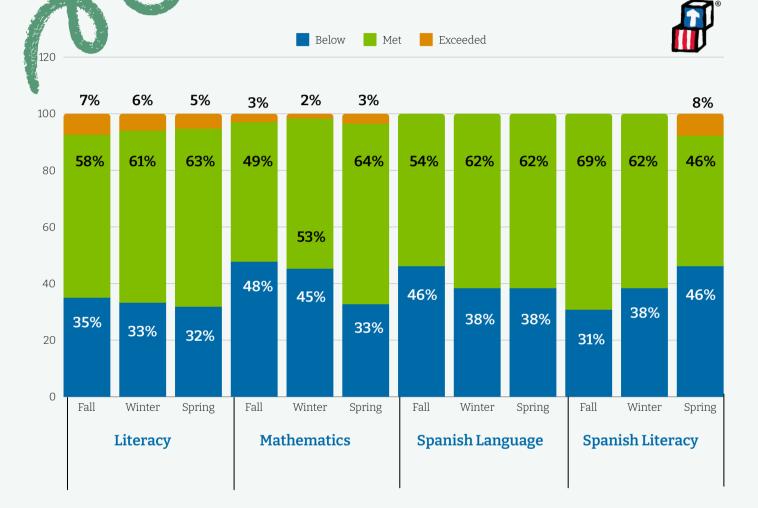

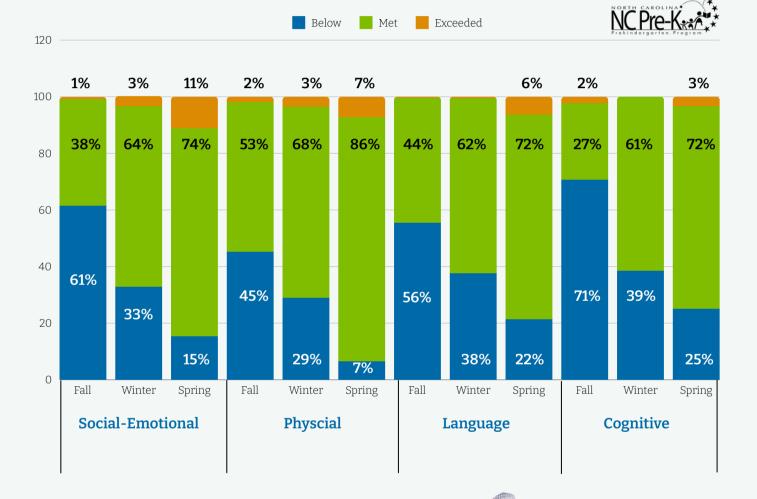

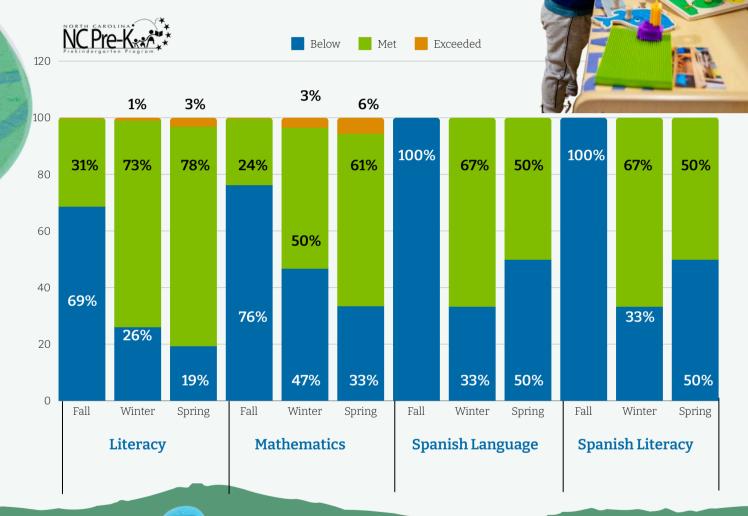


## NC Pre-K School Readiness Outcomes
